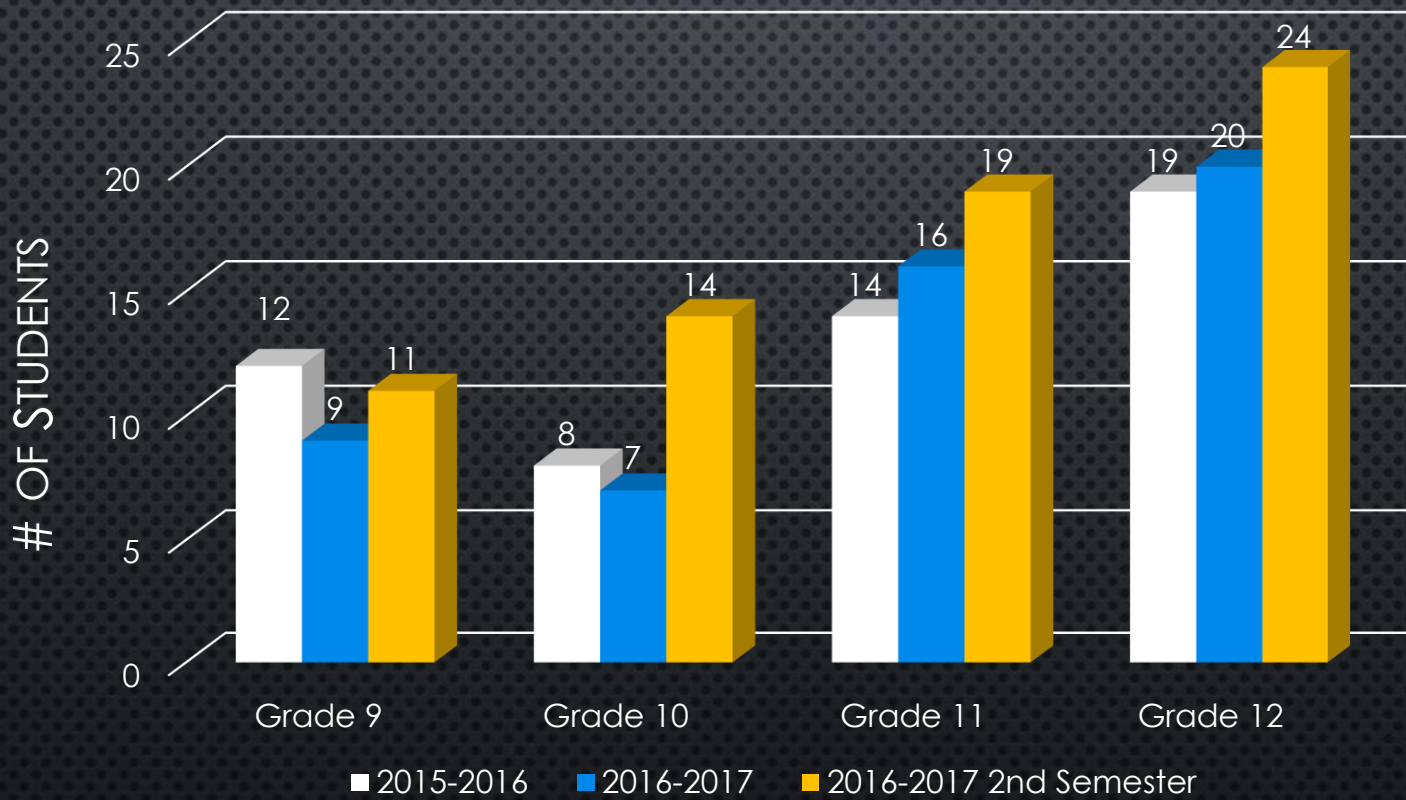

# of students with 16+ absences per semester



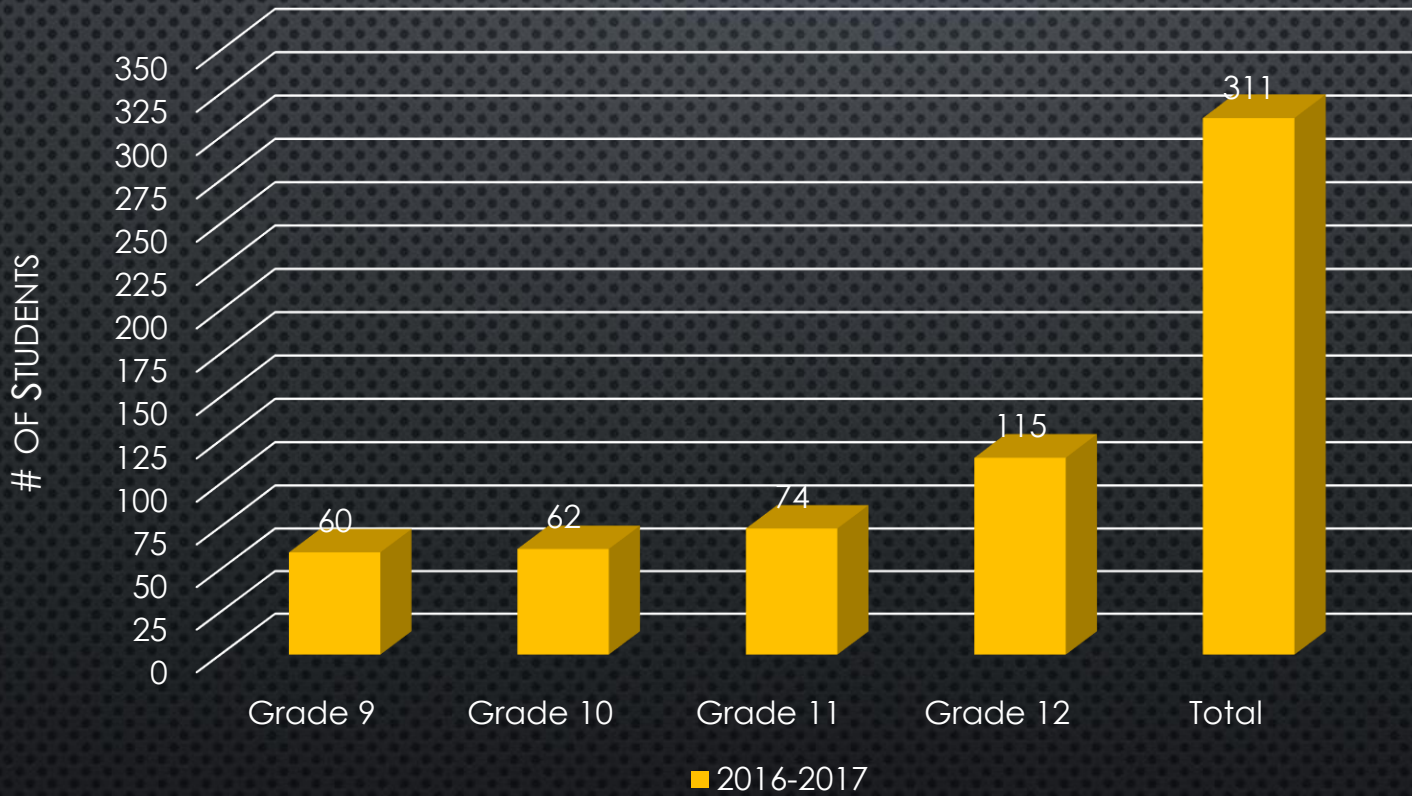

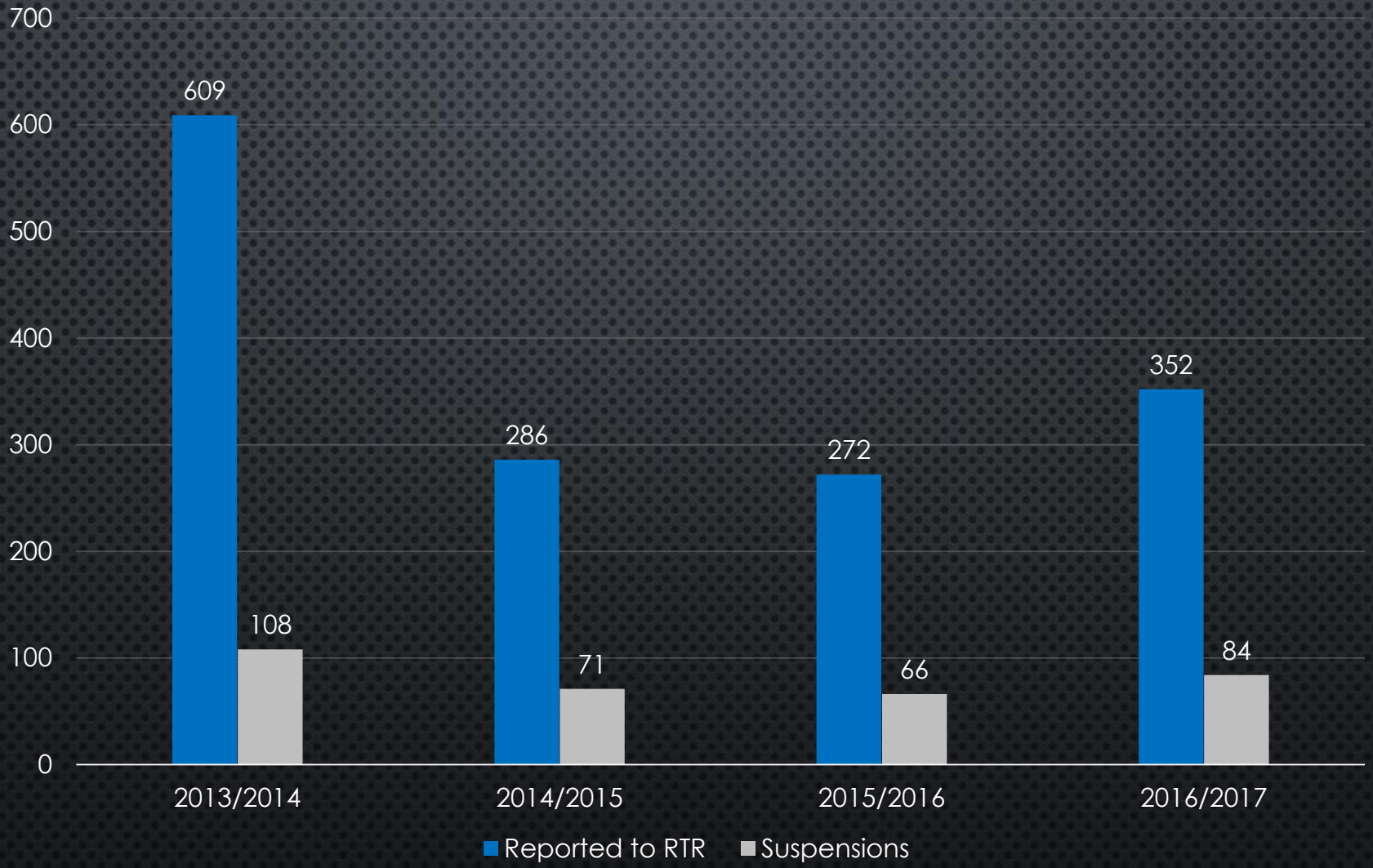

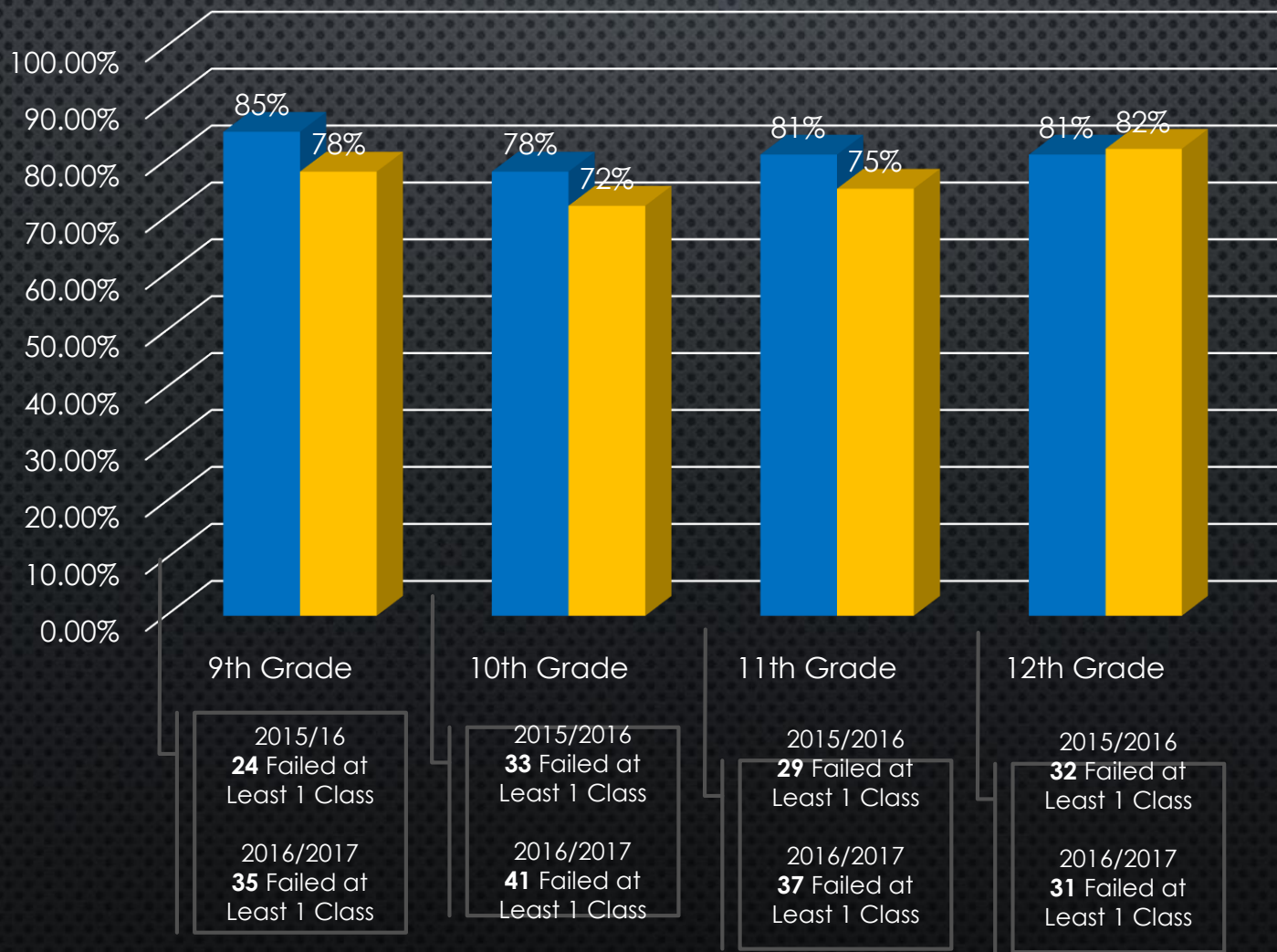

## COMPARISON Percent of Students Passing All Classes

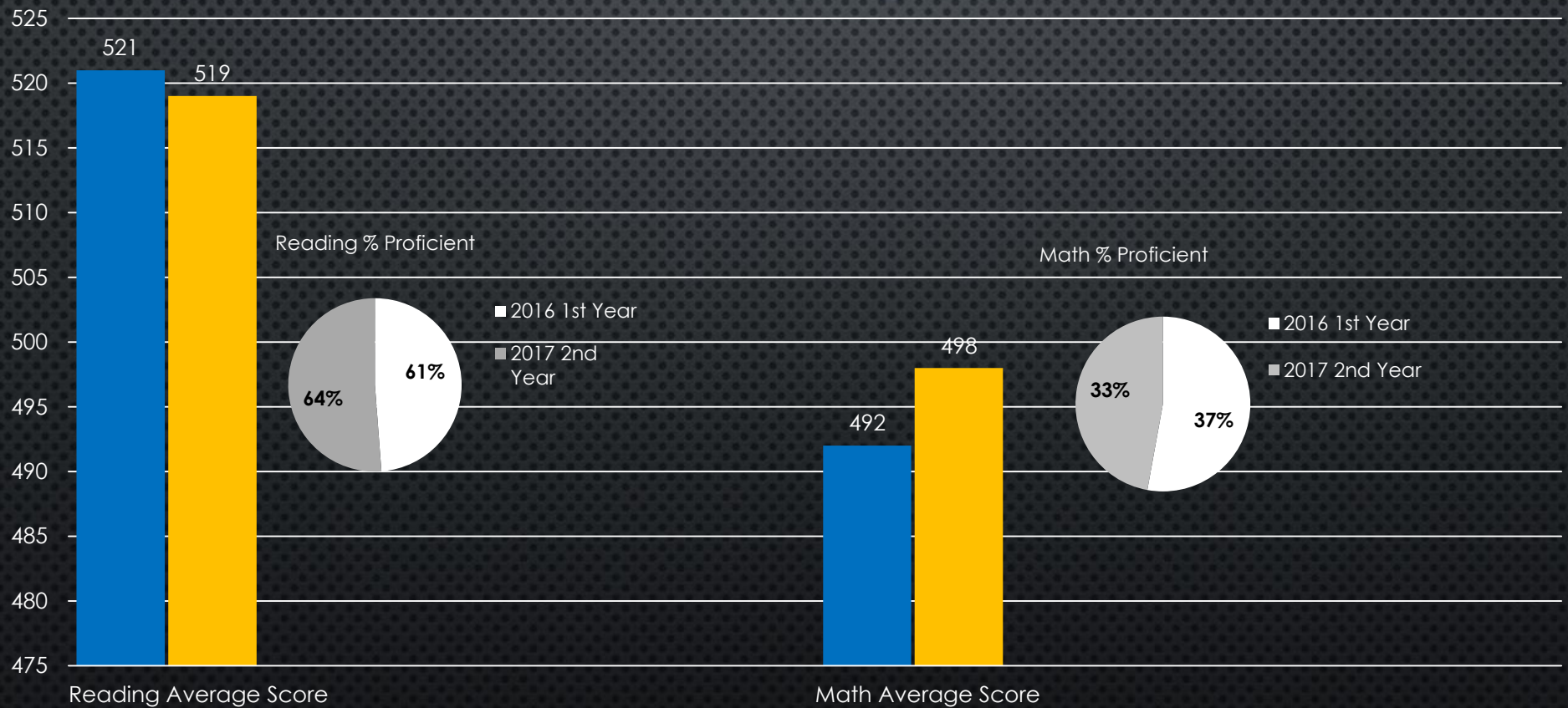
