









5th Grade Math, ELA, Social Studies M-STEP








■6th Math ■6th ELA



GROWTH WAS AS FOLLOWS BASED ON A GRADED RUBRIC FROM THE FIRST PIECE OT THE LAST PIECE

- The special education population performed closing the gap from 3.6 points to 1.4 rubric points in comparison to the general education popuation from the fall to the spring.
- The 5th grade gained on the average of 8.54 points improvement from the beginning of the year to the last piece of writing
- The 6th grade gained an average of 5.61 points
- The 7th grade gained an average of 5.17 points
- The 8th grade gained an average of 2.63 points
