Dear Mr. Fleenor:

The implementation of a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) is a priority of the Michigan Department of Education. In alignment with this priority, MIBLSI has recently developed a process for identifying and recognizing ISDs, districts, and schools who are demonstrating strong outcomes and/or making progress related to meeting the needs of each and every learner through MTSS. Congratulations! Upon reviewing project-wide capacity and fidelity data, we are seeing positive outcomes from Lakewood Public Schools.

We would like to include your district and schools and recognize your hard work at the MIBLSI state conference (Day 1), which is taking place April 12-13, 2018 in Lansing. We commend you for your hard work to build capacity for MTSS so that schools can implement with fidelity. This public recognition at the state conference represents the beginning stages of work on the road to a more fully developed recognition process in the future.

Below are the criteria we use to determine recognition for positive outcomes.

School-Level Recognition Criteria:

- Based on school scores from the School-wide Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports Tiered Fidelity Inventory (SWPBIS TFI) and Reading Tiered Fidelity Inventory (R-TFI)
- At least one Tier 1 score must have been collected and entered into MIDATA by 1/31/18 and have been collected since the 2016-17 school year.
- At least one of the following must be true when analyzing SWPBIS TFI and R-TFI scores:
 - Most recent Tier 1 score on SWPBIS TFI and/or R-TFI is at or above criterion (70% and 80% respectively)
 There has been an improvement of at least 10 percentage points when comparing at least the two most recent Tier 1 scores on SWPBIS TFI and/or R-TFI

District-Level Recognition Criteria:

- Based on scores from the District Capacity Assessment (DCA)
- Fall 2017 data must have been collected and entered into MIDATA
- Winter 2018 scores must have been collected and entered into MIDATA by 2/28/18
- At least one of the following must be true when analyzing scores:
 - OWinter 2018 DCA Total Score is 80% or higher
 - o When comparing Fall 2017 and Winter 2018 Total Scores, there has been an improvement of at least 10 percentage points
