- 1) **Trend of COVID-19 cases/positive COVID-19 tests**
The seven-day average percent positive has decreased over the past week(1/10 to 1/17) from 8.7 to 6.8%. The seven-day average for cases per million has decreased from 304 to 193.
- 2) **Hospitalizations due to COVID-19**
Four hospitalizations at SIH this week. Please recall that hospitalization numbers can change rapidly.
- 3) **Number of deaths resulting from COVID-19 in the past 14 days**
Nine for Ionia County
- 4) **COVID-19 cases for each day for every one million individuals**
Decreasing. You can get the daily numbers at <https://www.mistartmap.info/>

- 5) **Percentage of positive COVID-19 tests over a four-week period**
Decreased from 7.4 to 6.8% (seven-day average) from December 17th to January 17th.
- 6) **Health Care capacity strength**
Nobody knows what this means because the legislature did not define it.
- 7) **Testing, tracing, and containment infrastructure with regard to COVID-19**
Demand for testing is still down overall and turnaround time locally is around 48 hours. Tracing and Case Investigation continue to improve. Containment infrastructure is weak. We have no way to know if most people are truly complying with quarantine and isolation. This is a problem across the State.

K-12 can remain open provided there is no active transmission in the building. We are in Risk Category E as a County.
