#### Trend of COVID-19 cases/positive COVID-19 tests:

The seven-day average percent positive has decreased over the past week (3/6 to 3/13) from 3% to 2.4%. The seven-day average for cases per million has increased from 89 to 95.

#### Hospitalizations due to COVID-19:

Zero at SIH this week. Please recall that hospitalization numbers can change rapidly.

#### Number of deaths resulting from COVID-19 in the past 14 days:

Three for Ionia County

#### COVID-19 cases for each day for every one million individuals:

#### Percentage of positive COVID-19 tests over a four-week period:

Decreased from 3.7 to 2.4% (seven-day average) from February 13<sup>th</sup> toMarch 13<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Health Care capacity strength:**

Nobody knows what this means because the legislature did not define it.

#### Testing, tracing, and containment infrastructure with regard to COVID-19:

Demand for testing is still down overall and turnaround time locally is around 48 hours. Tracing and Case Investigation is steady, but the need to allocate staff for vaccination efforts means that response may be slower on clinic days. Containment infrastructure is weak.

K-12 can remain open provided there is no active transmission in the building. We are in Risk Category D as a County.

COVID-19 indicators are rising in many parts of the State. This is not yet fully reflected in our numbers, but I expect that it will be soon. Many of you are seeing more cases recently. Please remain vigilant with mitigation measures.
