Trend of COVID-19 cases/positive COVID-19 tests:

The seven-day average percent positive has decreased over the past week (5/8 to 5/15) from 15.6% to 10.6%. The seven-day average for cases per million has decreased from 340 to 198. Please note that State data for cases per million are incomplete for 5/15 – this number will likely increase over the new few days.

Hospitalizations due to COVID-19:

One currently hospitalized at SIH. Please recall that hospitalization numbers can change rapidly.

Number of deaths resulting from COVID-19 in the past 14 days:

One for Ionia County. Please recall that this is a lagging indicator.

COVID-19 cases for each day for every one million individuals:

Decreasing. You can get the daily numbers at https://www.mistartmap.info/

Percentage of positive COVID-19 tests over a four-week period:

Decreased from 19.3% to 10.6% (seven-day average) from April 15th to May 15th.

Health Care capacity strength:

Nobody knows what this means because the legislature did not define it.

Testing, tracing, and containment infrastructure with regard to COVID-19: Demand for testing is gradually decreasing. Turnaround time for PCR tests locally is between 24-48 hours. Tracing and Case Investigation are focused on school-aged cases. Containment infrastructure is weak.

K-12 can remain open provided there is no active transmission in the building. We are in Risk Category E as a County.

This week we had 92 new cases. There were 25 cases in the 0-19 age group over the last week (51 the prior week). It continues to be the strong recommendation of ICHD that schools quarantine all COVID-19 close contacts.
