Dear Lakewood Family,

In many ways, it is difficult to believe the end of the school year is upon us. As a result, this is a letter of reflection and anticipation. It's a letter of information and opinion. And, it's a letter of appreciation and congratulations.

Over the school year, I've been frustrated and confused at times by those I look to for information and direction. The Center for Disease Control (CDC), Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS), and Ionia and Barry-Eaton County health departments (ICHD, BEDHD), issue guidance, recommendations, and orders that at times were inconsistent or outright in conflict with one another. But, having met regularly with local health department officials, I know that behind the faceless acronyms are good people trying their best to keep people safe during what we all hope is a once in a century health crisis.

It's because none of us have experienced something like this that I think I understand why things haven't been as difficult since last August as they are now. I'm not referring to infection rates as those are thankfully coming down once again. Instead, the periods of time with the most uncertainty is that time going into and coming out of the pandemic. Last August was difficult in that we didn't know what school would look like and whether planned safety measures would work once staff and students returned to school buildings. But they did work. Many students that started in remote instruction returned in-person and, though we had quarantine situations throughout the year, the health department identified only one instance of positive transmission occurring from contact in school.

Looking forward, we are (hopefully) coming out of the pandemic, but, like last August, it's unclear as to what that looks like as well. Or, is it? We want it to look like school did pre-Covid, no temperature checks, no masks, ice cream socials, pep assemblies, band and choir concerts, field trips, etc. So, maybe what it looks like isn't unclear, it's how we get there. Here's where I may lose your attention and support.

I recently shared information regarding a health department vaccination clinic opportunity. I won't say I received several responses, but one that I did receive said, "Stop pushing vaccinations, what are you a doctor?" I could have replied, "Why, yes, I am. But, not a medical one, so I get your point." But, as I continue to think about that, I don't think I do get the person's point for I think that if I was a medical doctor, the person still may not accept the science, research, and testing that went into developing the vaccine.

So, let me put it this way, if next year, we don't want student-athletes tested weekly, we want to enjoy a high school musical production, we want the school experience to be "normal" again, we're going to have reach a level of vaccination that allows for this. Therefore, we are going to continue to provide information regarding vaccination opportunities when they become available such as **Tuesday**, **June 8th from 4:00-7:00 pm at Lakewood High School**. This Barry-Eaton District Health Department vaccination clinic will feature the Pfizer vaccine, which has been unanimously approved (with one abstention) by the CDC Advisory Panel.
