# RETURNING PUBLIC SCHOOLS LAKEWOOD MIDDLE SCHOOL 2020.2021

## **ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE**

### **MORNING GREETINGS**

7:10 Students who are dropped off by parents or high school siblings enter the front door of the building and stay in the marked areas enforcing social distancing or move to the cafeteria for breakfast.

7:15 Students dropped off from busses

- Breakfast Door is northeast side door
- 7 Busses enter the south front door along with parent drop off students
- 7 busses enter the southeast side door
- Breakfast students are greeted to sanitize hands, temperature checks and check for masks.
- Students move to cafeteria to eat (only 2 to a table)
- Students leaving the cafeteria will take care of their trash, sanitize hands and move to locker preparing for morning classes.

All other students will be greeted to sanitize hands, temperature checks and check for masks.

All students will immediately proceed to lockers and prepare for morning classes. Students will head directly to 1st hour always traveling on the right side of the divided hallways.

Restrooms will be open and cleaned permitting no more than three in the restroom at a time. The agenda holder will indicate the capacity of the restroom in use. Students will wait in the hallway until clear to enter.

### DISMISSAL

End of day dismissal will demand sanitizing of hands and masks worn out of the building. Staggered times are scheduled for students to retrieve all materials out of their lockers in preparation for home. Students will exit assigned doors with a staggered schedule.

Breakfast students are greeted to sanitize hands, temperature checks and check for masks. Students move to cafeteria to eat (only 2 to a table.) Students leaving the cafeteria will take care of their trash, sanitize hands and move to locker preparing for morning classes.

## LUNCHTIME

5th grade lunch students will sit with their homeroom not allowing more than 6 students at a large blue marked table. Students are expected to throw their trash away, clean up their area and sanitize hands before leaving for the recess playground.

Students will exit out cafeteria doors and re-enter the north facing blue hallway doors to proceed to afternoon classes. Students will sanitize hands and wear masks to re-enter the building.

The 6th, 7th and 8th graders will eat in Group A or Group B (6 per table alternating red and blue to allow time for proper cleaning between each new group of students to sit at a cafeteria table. Same lunchroom expectations are reinforced for all students. Same procedures of exiting and re-entering will be reinforced.

Students will wait in the lunchline with the marked social distancing to receive their lunch. Checkout will be performed by cafeteria employees.

## **SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL**

- Google classroom for teachers to access tools, materials, lessons, classroom activities and new referral forms for students in need.
- Support from The Right Door the first few days of school [if available]
- Classroom lessons with Second Step curriculum for 5th grade
- Daily physical and emotional health check in with staff
- PBIS videos for new building procedures

# RECESS/PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Physical Education classes will be gathering outside for activity whenever possible. Limited locker room use will be strongly encouraged. Locker rooms will be cleaned during the morning and afternoon sessions.

Activities are promoted to more independent skills than team/group activity.

All materials will be returned to a designated area for cleaning. Chromebooks will be wiped down as well. Students will gather all materials and wait in line to leave the classroom with sanitized hands.No locker visits during morning classes or afternoon classes. They visit the locker before the 1st hour, before afternoon classes and at the end of the day.Hallway movement /travel is directed on the right side of the hall with dividers placed allowing traffic flow in one direction.Restroom visits of no more than 3 students at a time will be enforced. However, student will be given permission by the teacher one at a time to visit the restroom with a pass (use of agenda with sanitizing hands on departure and return).If students are needing to leave school for the day, the office will wait for a parent to buzz and the student will be walked to meet up with the appropriate person for pickup.Hour 17:27 am - 8:17 amHour 28:21 am - 9:11 amHour 39:15 am -10:05 am.

- LMS will hope to offer Cross Country and Volleyball at the beginning of the 20-21 school year. The MHSAA has continued to provide updated guidance about practice and competition. Different sports have been identified as low, moderate and high risk. Limitations on distance of travel, number of schools at one single competition, and spectators continue to be updated in the Return to Play documents. Large tournaments and invitationals will likely be cancelled due to these constraints. LMS will follow all requirements as outlined by the MHSAA.
- Cross Country falls within the low risk category and has been approved to begin practice and competition as scheduled. A limit of 70 runners per race has been instituted to promote physical distancing. The total number of spectators allowed for indoor and outdoor competition will be based on future guidance from the governor's office.
- Volleyball is considered a moderate risk sport this fall and has more stringent guidelines for competition and practice. The main focus will be sanitation of the balls and bench areas. Only 4 teams will be allowed at one site for competition. Currently no indoor practice has been approved since school gyms are closed. More information is expected to be released on 8/20 from the MHSAA.
- Guidelines for Basketball, Wrestling, and Track will be communicated as the MHSAA provides regular updates
