As educators and parents, we understand the importance of trust to our home-to-school partnership. Our promise is to keep our school community apprised of any COVID 19-related school situation that <u>does not require a school closure</u> via this COVID COMMUNICATOR advisory tool. Please be assured that the district will follow the CDC/Health Department process for addressing Covid-related situations.

UPDATE.

The word "outbreak" has a scary connotation, but as used by local and state health departments and the CDC, an outbreak is two or more positive cases that are directly linked. As the Lakewood Public Schools completed its tenth week of in-person and remote instruction, two new positive cases were reported but there was no link between them and therefore we have not experienced an outbreak. Also, it is important to understand that there have been no incidents of transmission of the virus within a school building.

This week, an individual at Lakewood Elementary School tested positive resulting in twenty-four others to be quarantined as close contacts and one person at LHS tested positive and nine related close contacts being quarantined. Three additional Lakewood staff or students were quarantined as close contacts to non-school related individuals who tested positive.
